Wilsons look to spread pickleball abroad

THE VILLAGES - Ever since Ian and Maureen Wilson learned to play pickleball in 2009, they have been enamoured with the sport.

The Village of Hemingway residents are English transplants from Kidlington, Oxforshire, England who spend part of the year in The Villages.

After learning how to play and officiate their newfound favorite sport, the couple went back to the U.K. and immediately missed it.

There aren't a lot of clubs around (the U.K.)," Ian said. "Not a lot of people play over there. It is hard to find a place to play."

So the Wilsons started their own club.

They called around and searched for anyone who also played pickleball in England. And after finding all the information he could, Ian began the process of creating a national pickleball association in England.

A short five years later, in June this year, the Wilsons officially created the United Kingdom Pickleball Association.

The UKPA has approximately 20 affiliated clubs and more than 200 players from Great Britain. The organization is picking up steam, and the Wilsons hope it continues.

"When we first started, we had about 10 people," Maureen said. "Then our club grew to about 24, then other clubs sprouted up. It has been spread-

ing like a web."

Ian got his 15 minutes of fame during his time promoting the sport overseas. He started a program through Go Active to promote the sport to all ages, and when the BBC noticed the new sport, they decided to work together.

They had a guy who would try any sport," Ian said. "So he came to us and did filming to help push the sport and bring it to people's attention. The response we got was great. A lot of people saw the program and wanted to try it. I was amazed how many people saw it."

The Wilsons never could have imagined that when

they started this new sport called pickleball in Florida's Friendliest Hometown that it would lead to this. Now the couple puts as much effort into spreading the sport internationally as it can.

So far, the Wilsons have

been doing well with what they have. They even got a group of players to compete in an international tournament in

Amsterdam earlier this year.

"Pickleball isn't a recognized sport in the UK, which puts up barriers for funding," lan said. "Once the IFP makes the approval, we can get the sport recognized by England. We had a chicken and the egg situation, but we hope we have it worked out."
